# Welcome...

Welcome to the latest edition of One Business Briefing! As Business Champion for the District, I was delighted to receive the bids of our town centre partnerships (TCPs) for the District Council's new economic development initiative fund of £35k. Amongst the bids, there were some new and innovative ideas, as well as others that were tried and tested and had previously been successful. Bids included town centre apps for smartphones, a new signage idea, festivals and advertising to increase footfall into the high streets. In excess of £30,000 has been awarded to Ongar Town Forum, Loughton High Road TCP, Buckhurst Hill TCP and Loughton Broadway TCP, as well as supporting, for the first time, a joint bid for a combination of town centres and also one from the Chamber of Commerce for a district-wide idea.

The new fund has already helped generate renewed interest in the important role the Town Centre Partnerships can have in bringing traders and residents together to support local activity. The next edition of One Business Briefing will be reporting back on how the new projects are getting on.

# 1. Economic Development Initiatives Fund continues to offer support

The District Council and its partners in One Epping Forest are committed to enhancing the vibrant and diverse high streets in the District, as shown by initiatives such as the One Shops Local and Visit Epping Forest websites. With that in mind, it set up a fund, totalling £35,000 for the current financial year, for its Town Centre Partnerships and other groups to come up with ideas to support our high streets.

A first bidding round in May 2013, focussed on town centres as key in providing significant local employment and injecting money into the local economy. It resulted in the award of funding to schemes in Buckhurst Hill, Loughton Broadway, Loughton High Road and Ongar. Further details of the successful Ongar bid are covered in the next article

A second bidding round closed in early October. In this round the panel were looking for schemes/projects which not only promote shopping centres as places for social interaction, focal points for the community and providing residents with a good way of life, but which have some or all of the following elements:

- Are innovative and test new ideas
- · Help co-ordinate and promote activity across the District
- · Have positive District-wide implications

A total of five bids were received including individual bids from Epping, Loughton Broadway and Waltham Abbey Town Centre Partnerships, a joint bid from Buckhurst Hill, Chigwell, and Loughton High Road Town Centre Partnerships, and a bid from Epping Forest Chamber of Commerce for funding to support the One Shops Local scheme which now has almost 330 businesses taking part.

The new Epping Forest Town Teams Group, including representatives from all of our town centres, will now meet regularly to monitor the projects and discuss other ways to support our high streets.

## 2. Signs are positive for Ongar following success in Town Centre Funding Bid

As a member of the Ongar Town Forum (OTF), Simon Hanney, General Manager of Epping Ongar Railway, was involved in the OTF's bid for funding as part of the first round of the District Council's Economic Development Initiative Fund. Here he explains some of the thinking that went into the Ongar bid and some of the initiatives they will be implementing following their success.

"The welcome that Ongar gave to visitors, whether arriving in car parks or via train services needed attention, as signage and information about the town was poor. The OTF made a bid to improve this and we are delighted to have received a grant of £6,000 towards work in conjunction with improving the trading for the retailers on the High Street.

"Ongar Town Forum's bid consisted of three approaches; installing signage with finger posts and map boards at key arrival points such as car parks and the train station; producing and distributing leaflets; and providing a virtual trading website for Ongar town centre to assist with online trading in conjunction with an Ongar App and QR code which can be scanned to give further information on the town and its products."

### 3. Support for your business - just a click away

Epping Forest is already a great place to be, a place where people aspire to live. We want the district to be an even better place to live, work, study and do business in. #### 4. Local Plan moves forward - new timetable announced

Epping Forest District Council is working towards a new Local Plan, which will guide development for the next 20 years.

The new Local Plan will seek the appropriate balance between protecting green spaces, and providing new homes, businesses, shops and leisure and will include:

- A vision for how the district will develop;
- · A plan setting out appropriate locations for development; and
- Policies to manage housing, employment, green space, community facilities, etc.

Preparing a new Local Plan involves at least three formal stages of public consultation. The 'Community Choices' consultation (also known as Issues & Options) took place in 2012 and collected the views of almost 6,000 people and organisations, on topics as wide ranging as Green Belt, potential development sites, community facilities, housing numbers, economic development and transport. Councillors and officers from the Forward Planning team are working together, using the consultation responses, and background technical studies (investigating things like population growth and flood risk), to work towards the next stage of consultation in 2014.







This will be called the 'Preferred Options' or 'Draft Plan', and will begin during the Summer next year. This consultation will be more focused, narrowing down the range of options and the 'pot' of potential development sites.

The third and final stage of formal consultation, called 'Pre-Submission' will take place in Spring 2015, and then there will be an Examination in Public, by an independent inspector, in early 2016. Final adoption of the new Local Plan is expected to take place in Summer 2016.

# 6. Epping Ongar Railway on track with the support of Visit Epping Forest

Shortly after Epping Ongar railway, national 'Heritage Railway of the Year 2012', resumed steam train services in May 2012, they suggested to the District Council and One Epping Forest that more could be done to support tourism throughout the district.

The heritage railway and buses link together a number of attractions and destinations, bringing in over 25,000 visitors in their first six months and contributing to the local economy whilst at the same time respecting the forest and countryside through which they travel.



## 8. Claim cash incentive to make a difference to disabled youth unemployment

Work Choice is a financial incentive scheme which can help you to employ a disabled person who needs specialist support.

It's a voluntary programme to help:

- disabled people who find it hard to get and keep a job
- employed people whose jobs are at risk because of their disability

Work Choice is delivered by various organisations from the public, private and third sectors ('providers'). A provider will work with you to develop a package of support specially designed for your business and the individual with the aim of developing their skills.

You can offer any type of work but it must be 16 hours or more per week to qualify.

### Stansted meeting targets jobs and opportunities

A delegation from the District has met with the new owners of Stansted airport to push for greater links and opportunities for the districts companies and residents. The Council party which included leader Chris Whitbread and a representative from the local Job Centre Plus, had a hour long meeting with Andrew Harrison Chief Executive of Manchester Airport Group. This focused on the new owners and their ambitious plans for investment in the airport and the generation of thousands of new jobs linked to long term deals for airlines. Cllr Whitbread said "It was a very useful meeting, and I hope it has laid the foundations for making sure the district gets the best out of the opportunities the airport brings"

### **Superfast Broadband**

The latest plans for the rollout of superfast broadband across the district have been published on **www.superfastessex.org** following the signing of the contract with partners BT. Plans are being developed for a major Superfast Seminar in the district where local businesses can come along and find out where they fit in the roll out and meet other companies that have used broadband to grow their business. Cllr Anne Grigg said "Broadband is a priority for us. We know how important this will be to attract and retain business in our district and we are working hard to make sure that our needs are high on the roll out programme".

### **District hosts Essex team**

As part of its programme of promoting the District, its needs and opportunities for inward investment, a special tour was held for senior councillors and officers of Essex County Council led by Cllr Kevin Bentley, the portfolio holder for Economic Development and



Growth. Cllr Anne Grigg who, along the with the leader Cllr Whitbread accompanied Cllr Bentley commented "It was good that Kevin gave up so much time from a very busy schedule to come along and meet so many of our local businesses and attractions. Sometimes it's easy to feel that

the district is physically on the margins of the county and as such we don't attract our fair share of investment. It was clear from the discussion that took place throughout the tour that Kevin and his officers are really anxious to work with us locally to deliver better opportunities for all our residents". Cllr Bentley was welcomed at Catch 22, a catering training establishment, Epping Ongar Railway, North Weald Airfield, Epping Forest College, Valley Grown Nurseries and the White Water Centre, before concluding with a meeting with Eleanor Laing MP and other local businesses in Waltham Abbey.





### **Food for thought**

The district has established a new food taskforce to look at the future of the protected growing industry locally. Once home to the largest concentration of glasshouses in the world the footprint of the industry has declined over recent years but still manages to account for 75% of the nations cucumbers and 50% of its sweet peppers. The taskforce, which currently includes representatives from the growers, the National Farmers Union and senior councillors from Enfield and Broxbourne, hopes to also welcome Councillors from Waltham Forest and Uttlesford to the project. Cllr Richard Bassett, Chairman of the Taskforce commented "Issues around food security, food miles, access to free fruit and vegetables, and obesity, together with issues of youth unemployment are climbing the agenda. The district has had a massive heritage around growing for London and we are now looking at its future and whether it can contribute to some of these other areas." It is hoped that the task force recommendations will be reported to a special food summit locally in March.
