## Chigwell Neighbourhood Plan 2018-2033

## Notice of an Exploratory Meeting

I have been appointed by Epping Forest District Council with the agreement of Chigwell Parish Council as the Independent Examiner to examine the above neighbourhood plan under the Neighbourhood Planning Regulations 2012.

I have decided to call a non-statutory, exploratory meeting to examine issues of a procedural and compliance nature to initially assess whether the Chigwell Neighbourhood Plan meets the legislative requirements. It will not be a public hearing held under the provision of the relevant neighbourhood plan legislation. The meeting will take place on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> September 2018 starting at 10am. The venue is Chigwell Parish Council Offices, Hainault Road, Chigwell, Essex. IG7 6QZ. Whilst the meeting will be open to the public I will only be inviting the participation of representatives of Chigwell Parish Council and Epping Forest District Council.
