4.	Quality Review Panel and Development Management Forum	
	• The Quality Review Panel was set up in April 2018. It is a expert panel set up to provide advice to site promotors and the local planning authority. As set out in the Local Plan sites of 50 units or more are expected to go to the QRP. Other smaller or contentious sites may also be reviewed. This is part of the Council's commitment to promote high quality design as set out in Policy DM 9.	
	<ul> <li>Frame who manage the Quality Review Panel will liaise with developers to provide the necessary information in advance of the Panel meetings.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>The Development Management Forum is a crucial part of the masterplanning process as this helps provide information on schemes at early stage to the local community.</li> </ul>	
5.	Housing Implementation Strategy Update: Discussion Paper	
	<ul> <li>TT explained the topic paper which showed the proposed housing trajectory and the housing land supply. The Council has needed to update this prior to the hearing sessions as a result in the delay in submitting the plan for examination arising from the Judicial Review</li> <li>TT stated that when the Local Plan Submission version was published in 2017 the approach was slightly different, but the Council is now proposing a stepped trajectory.</li> <li>EFDC would like applicant's comments on their individual sites by 7</li> </ul>	Developers to read through topic paper and provide comments. 6.	Epping Forest Special Area of Conservation – Mitigation Strategy	
	• Epping Forest has the highest level of protection in legislation for ecological value. As part of the Council's habitat regulations assessment two pathways have been identified as having an impact on the Forest: recreational pressure and air quality.	
	<ul> <li>The Council is working closely with Natural England and the Conservators of Epping Forest to develop the HRA and the mitigation strategy.</li> </ul>	
	• With respect to the impact on recreational pressure – a visitor survey had been undertaken and is available on the website. A draft mitigation strategy is being prepared including SAMMS measures.	

		<u>Actions</u>
	The Council will then take forward measures to propose SANGS to provide alternative greenspace to the Forest.	
•	A further visitor survey is planned in 2019 to cover the summer period.	
•	Natural England have guidance on SANGS which explains the minimum is 8 Hectares per 1,000 population. To provide alternative for dog walkers the minimum area is thought to be 30 Hectares or links to public pathways extended for longer walks.	DC to provide information
•	Masterplanning sites will need to play an important role in helping with SANGS. We are factoring in costs not just on the Garden Town but also other sites, for instance if one site needs a SANG whereas the other doesn't, we are looking at how to make sure the cost is being apportioned against both sites.	of SAC.
•	Air Quality is proving to be incredibly complex, the high court judgement last year advised that we need to assess the local plan in terms of the other local plans which have already taken place and we need to consider projects and work done on air quality.
