Members Guide to Local Government

A three-tier local government is a system of governance where there are three levels of elected bodies that have certain responsibilities and powers. These levels include:

- 1. Parish or Town Councils
- 2. District Councils
- 3. County Councils

Below is a brief overview of the roles and responsibilities of each level of local government:

1. Parish or Town Councils: They are the smallest form of local government and typically represent a small community or village.

They are responsible for local issues such as:

- Allotments
- Benches
- Burial Grounds
- Bus shelters some not all
- Cemeteries
- Christmas lights
- Community Centres
- Community days/fun fairs
- Grounds maintenance
- Markets
- Playgrounds
- Recreation grounds
- Removal of illegal signs on lampposts or fly posting
- Some public bins which ones? Logos Loughton Rec Ground where lake is bins are Loughton Town Council responsibility – dog bin is ours
- Town/Village halls
- War memorials
- Welcome signs & notice boards

2. District Councils: They cover a larger area than Parish Councils. They often work with Parish Councils on matters that affect the whole community.

They are responsible for services such as:

- Benefits
- Business rates
- Council Tax
- Crime
- Environment
- Housing
- Leisure

- Licensing
- Parking
- Planning
- Waste Collections public litter bins and dog bins
