


Bobbingworth Nature Reserve



Reserve Area: 9.15 hectares

Access: From the car park there is a green metal walk around, to a hardened path leading a circular route around the site.

Parking: Car Park off Moreton Bridge Road nearest postcode: CM5 0LN What3words; yards.react.foods Grid Ref: TL 53679 06273



Site Description: A former gravel pit and landfill site between Moreton and Bobbingworth, restored by Veolia and open as a Nature Reserve in 2011. It is predominantly grassland, sown with wildflowers with patches of trees and shrubs, and has a wetland area at its southern end. **Site Management:** The site is managed for wildflower and grass meadow being cut and removed yearly.

Seasonal: Bird's- foot- trefoil can be seen growing along the pathways of the site from May to September, with Bee Orchids seen around the site from June – July. Grass Snake may be spotted in a warm sunny place from April – September, using the sites many habitat piles for egg laying.
